

Short-term Studies by Post-doctoral Clinician-Scientists: Small Pilot Awards of up to \$5,000 are available for residents, fellows, and other clinical trainees whose mentors do not have financial support for the specific projects they seek to undertake. The applicant must be a Resident, Fellow, or other Clinical Trainee with the University of Chicago Medical Center, Rush University, NorthShore University Health System or Loyola University and must provide information why her/his mentor is unable to provide financial support to the project. Applicants should expect to remain at the University of Chicago to complete their awarded project.

<u>Full applications</u> should consist of a <u>single PDF file</u> and a separate Excel budget on the required template:

- 1. Lay Summary/Abstract (limited to 250 words)
- 2. A 7-page NIH-style research proposal including Specific Aims (1 page), and Research Plan (6 pages, including Significance, Innovation, and Approach).
- 3. NIH biosketch for the applicant and all mentors involved in the project (or CV)
- 4. Budget justification for all items requested within the budget template (see below). Requests for salary support must be detailed. Budgets for non-University of Chicago organizations should account for the organization's staff benefits. No indirect costs are allowed for any institution. Description of other funds (if any) available to support the project.
- 5. Letters of support from two mentors for trainee applicants
- 6. If the project involves human subjects, please include the following (outside of 7- page limitation):
- Data Safety Monitoring Plan (summary paragraph)
- IRB protocol or submission forms if not already IRB approved

Additionally, a budget on the required ITM budget template should be included to match the justification (item #5).

Applications are being accepted October 1, 2023 – October 31, 2023

Funding decisions will be made mid-late November
